The top high school marksmen from across the state will take aim as they compete for the prized state championship title in the 17th Annual Civilian Marksmanship Program/HHSAA Air Riflery State Championships, Tuesday, Oct. 27, at Kamehameha Schools-Maui.

While there is some variation among the leagues on team size and selection processes to the state championship, all utilize the sporter air rifle in three-position competition. Precision air rifles are not allowed. League competition, with the exception of Maui, is primarily team-based with an individual championship ending the season.

Hawaii's state championship is the largest in the nation among high schools, and one of two states in the U.S. that are sanctioned by the high school athletic governing body. The other association who fielded participants in the 2014-15 school year, according to the NFHS participation survey data, was the District of Columbia, which reported a total of eight boys.

2015 SHOOTING RELAYS MODIFICATION

For 2015 tournament, there will be three shooting relays of 40 shooters per relay due to space limitation at Kamehameha-Maui site. The firing points will be allocated as follows:

Relay 1	40 boys
Relay 2	20 boys & 20 girls
Relay 3	40 girls

TOURNAMENT PROCEDURE, RULES AND SCORING

All 60 competitors in each gender fire in three positions: prone, standing and kneeling. Shooters fire 20 shots in each position.

All competitors shoot at the same time, beginning with the prone position. The targets are 32.8 feet away.

Twenty minutes are allowed for prone shooting. When completed the targets are retrieved and standing targets are mounted.

There is a five-minute changeover period between shooting positions to prepare for the next phase. The shooters are given a five-minute sighting in period.

Twenty-five minutes are allowed for standing shooting. When completed, those targets are retrieved and kneeling targets are mounted.



TOURNAMENT PROCEDURE, RULES AND SCORING (continued)

There is a five-minute changeover period between shooting positions to prepare for the next phase. The shooters are given a five-minute sighting in period.

Twenty minutes are allowed for kneeling shooting.

All competitors use Sporter air rifles; precision air rifles are not allowed. Shooters fire 20 shots in each position. A bulls-eye scores 10 points and each ring out from the center scores fewer points.

The maximum points possible in individual competition are 600. Saint Louis's Kenneth Tong holds the boys individual record with 553 points shot in 1999, while Punahou's Vicci Yau holds the girls record with 557 points shot in 2002.

Team scores are drawn from a team's four highest scorers.

ALOHA ED CHANG

After 17 years of dedicated service, the Hawaii High School Athletic Association's only air riflery coordinator in the history of the

tournament, Ed Chang, will retire following the Oct. 27 meet on Maui.

Among other planning details, Chang serves as the liaison between the HHSAA and the Civilian Marksmanship Program, the tournament's title sponsor.

Chang will continue to remain involved in the behind-the-scenes work of future tournaments supporting his successor, Fred Hu, who has assisted Chang as line supervisor since 1999.
