The **First Hawaiian Bank/HHSAA Football State Championships** concludes this Friday, Nov. 20, with the D2/D1 championship doubleheader at Aloha Stadium.

DIVISION I

#2 Saint Louis Crusaders (9-1) vs. #1 Kahuku Red Raiders (12-0)

ILH champ Saint Louis and OIA champ Kahuku have met 10 times in title games dating back to the Oahu Prep Bowl era, with Saint Louis leading the series, 6-4. But Kahuku has won the last four contests.

Kahuku is coming off a 13-0 semifinal victory over Wai'anae at Aloha Stadium. The Red Raiders rushed for 168 yards, including 142 on 40 carries by Kesi Ah-Hoy, and held the Seariders to just 76 total yards and eight first downs.

The Red Raiders are seasoned in state tournament play, boasting a 22-5 record (0.815 pct.), and a record seven state titles. But the Crusaders are led by the most prolific coach in Hawaii high school history, Cal Lee, who is in his third stint with the school. Lee has amassed a record of 256-37-5 over 23 seasons leading into Friday's championship game.

DIVISION II

#2 Radford Rams (12-0) vs. #1 Kapa'a Warriors (9-0)

The Division II final is a battle of unbeaten.

Kaua'i Interscholastic Federation champion Kapa'a is coming off a 24-0 semifinal victory over Lahainaluna at Vidinha Stadium in Lihue. The Warriors rushed for 265 yards, including Kalena Harder's 98 yards (and three touchdowns) on 20 carries. Kapa'a is making its first state title game appearance, one year after barely losing to eventual champion 'Iolani in a thrilling semifinal. Kapa'a also reached the state semifinals in 2011, losing to eventual champion 'Iolani.

Radford is coming off a pulsating 48-46 victory over Konawaena at Roosevelt's Ticky Vasconcellos Stadium. The Rams led, 48-33, entering the fourth quarter but the Wildcats rallied with two touchdowns and gained one final possession with 16 seconds remaining, but could not advance the ball past their own 33-yard line as time expired. Radford's Kodi Ongory-Mathias rushed for 176 yards and one TD on 26 carries, and quarterback Quintin Iriarte completed 18 of 32 passes for 288 yards and one touchdown. The Rams are making their third DII title game appearance but first since 2008. They lost to 'Iolani in both previous appearances (2005 and 2008).

DIVISION I HALFTIME FESTIVITIES:

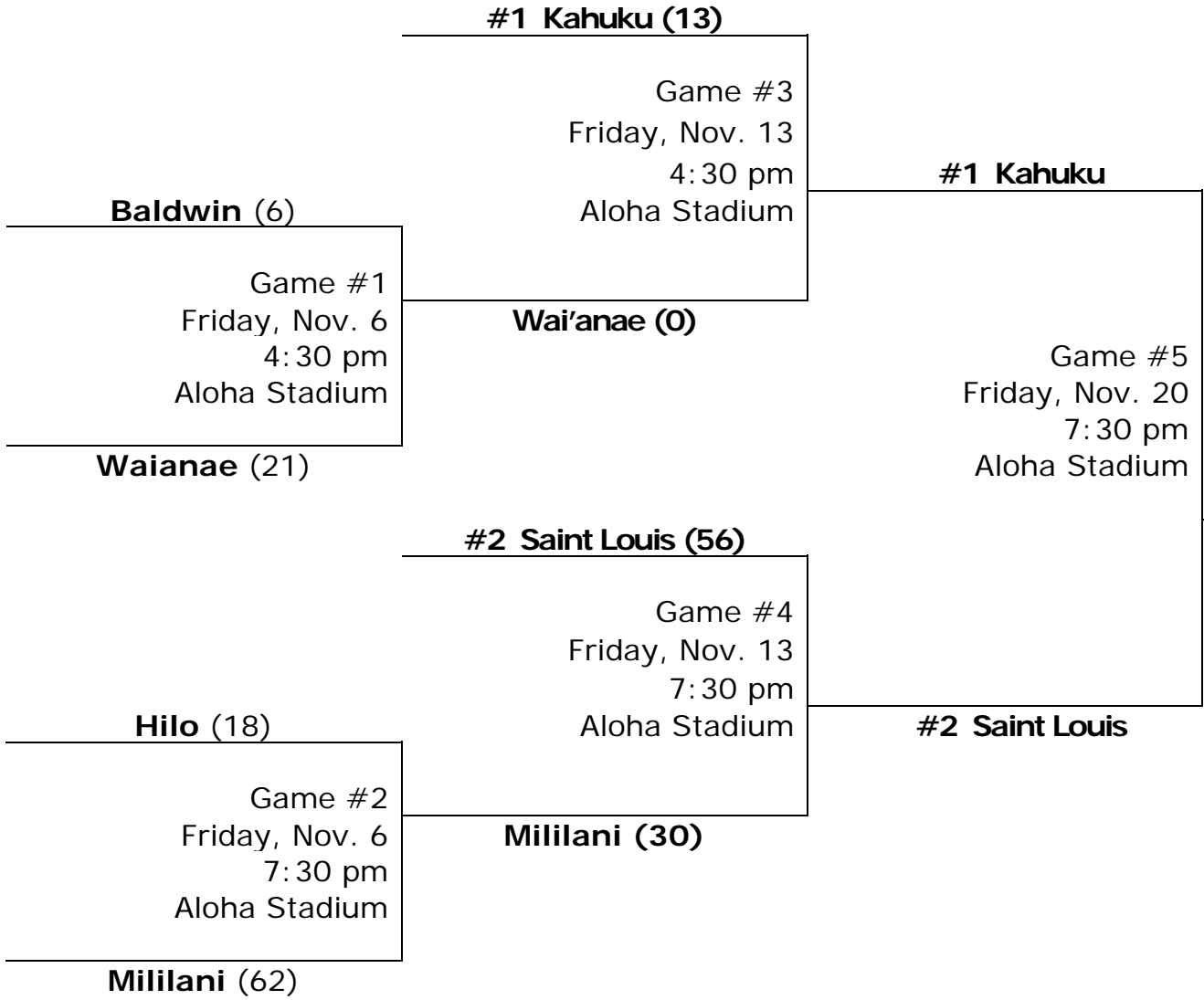

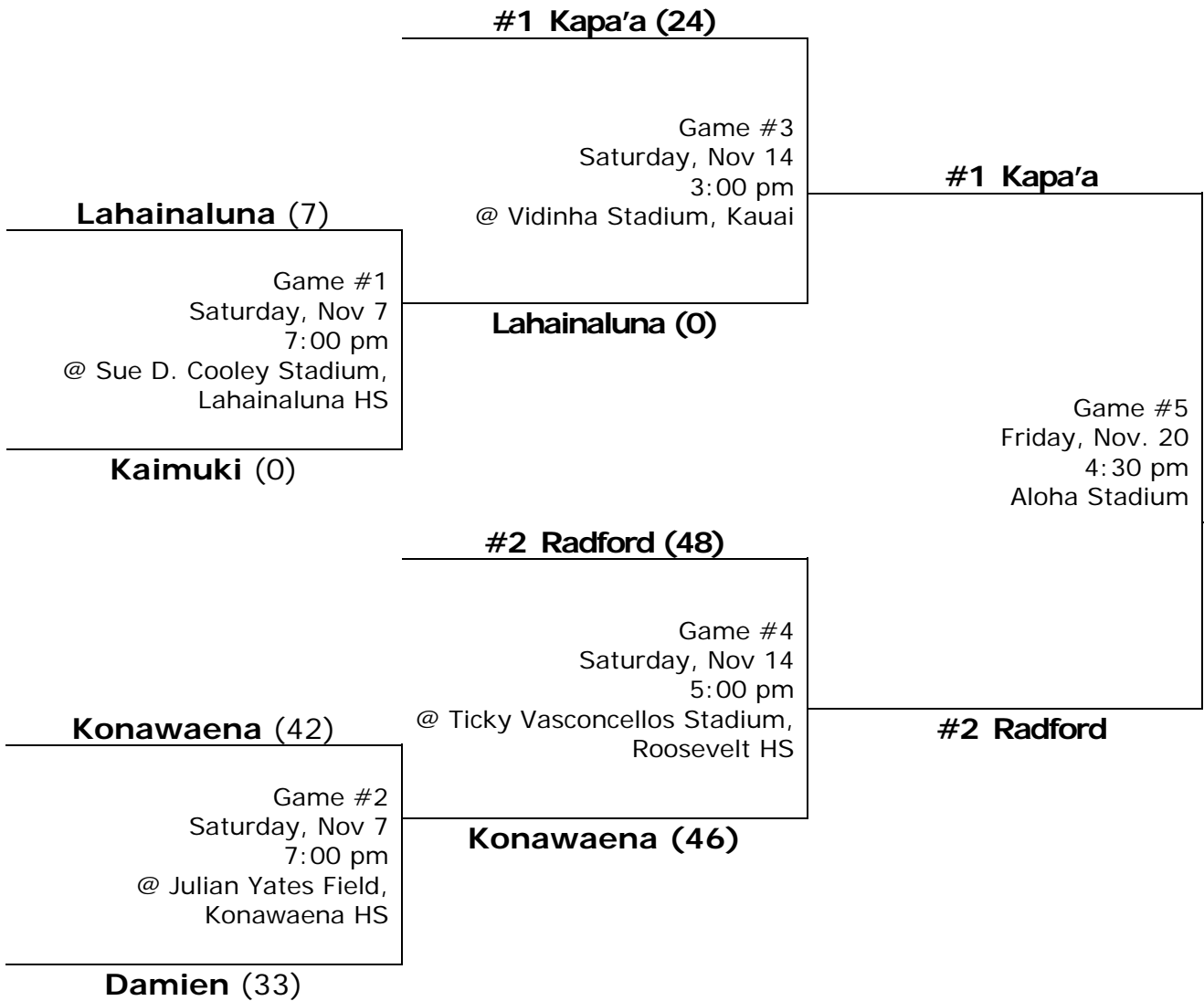
